
Carol Service

Students completed a range of sessions themed on respect and wellbeing. These





included taking part in a relaxation through creativity session. During the relaxation session students discussed ways to help them relax and strategies to help their own wellbeing, whilst sculpting clay sculptures. The day also included the 'Five Lives' workshop, which gave students the chance to listen to the stories of regular people who have overcome struggles such as alcohol addiction and self harm. After hearing their stories, students were able to ask questions and speak with the visiting guests to learn about the dangers of addiction and substance abuse. Finally students met with PCSO Phil Thomas to discuss the law surrounding drugs, and a session with School nurse Tracey Wills. The day had a positive impact on students and we'd like to thank all the visiting guests who made it so successful.

GCSE Celebration Evening

Around 80 ex-Year 11 students attended an Awards ceremony on 5th December to celebrate the achievements of their GCSE year at the College. 
Youth Theatre Rehearsals

Rehearsals are well under way for the next Sidmouth Youth Theatre production at The Manor Pavilion on the 5th to 8th February. Over 60 students are involved in retelling of the true story of 'Korczak'.

Set in Warsaw during World War II, Korczak tells the true story of a man who, in the impossible circumstances. most childhood alive through and imagination for a group of children within his care in a war torn country. The musical is inspired by Korczak's diary which was smuggled out of the Treblinka concentration camp. The diary recorded the experiences of the children's lives in the orphanage, the ghetto and their final journey to Treblinka. It features some inspiring solo performances and soaring choral work, with lots of acting opportunities for students in Years 8 and 9. The story aims to inspire hope and spirit, even during the darkest of times

Alevel Drama and Devised Original Theatre

This half term the A level group performed 'Truth....' as part of their A level exam. This piece was created by the students in response to detailed research into the Chernobyl Disaster which took place on 25th April 1986. It began as a piece in the style of Story- telling theatre but as they developed their understanding of events which revealed many instances where the Russian authorities withheld information and risked the lives of the people it became a Docu-theatre piece in the style of Bertolt Brecht' Epic Theatre. Students are marked for their inventive stagecraft and their ability to apply the methods and style of a renowned theatre practitioner.



The aims of the piece were to inform the audience of events leading up to and beyond the disaster and to highlight the part the Russian government played in concealing the truth from civilians and the world.

Today the town of Pripyat remains a radioactive wasteland where some people are still living there despite the risks and where tourists can visit.

Audience members were shocked by the revelations and the questions raised by the piece which successfully engaged them. Actors multi-roled many characters, narrated, recreated moments in time using physical theatre and used the technique of removing the fourth wall to break down the barrier between the audience and the actors.

One member of the group chose to be examined in set design where she designed a striking set for the piece in keeping with the theories of the practitioner including projections and banners reinforcing the lies and untruths that featured in the piece.





42nd Street

A group of 50 students were given the opportunity to see a classic live screening of the recent West End revival of the Musical '42nd Street' on Tuesday 12th November at the Radway Cinema.



Performed at the renowned

Theatre Royal, Drury Lane, this was a celebration of Broadway in the 30's where Tap dance was showcased. This show follows the lives of performers as they struggle to make their names on Broadway in 1930's New York.

We were treated to a huge cast of 60 dancers that tapped their way through this extravagant musical featuring well known greats, 'Lullaby of Broadway' and 'We're in the Money'.

So many of our students dance with various schools in East Devon and to be able to see the quality of the tap was a treat for all. The opportunities to see theatre of quality continues to provide students with the opportunity to see theatre and performances without the transport costs and the expensive ticket prices. We are fortunate to have this facility in the town.

"It was really emotional and I was thinking about it all evening. I didn't know that the passenger seat is referred to as 'the sacrificial seat' by those in the emergency services, it has made me think twice about sitting in that seat". "It was really impactful how real it all was. I have decided to get a car with a smaller engine so I will drive slower."



Artist Workshop

On Friday 15th November a selection of talented and keen art students were invited to take part in a printing workshop run and organised by Jeremy Speck from Double Elephant Print Workshops and Anna Aroussi from the Thelma Hulbert Gallery.

During the day students looked at examples of screen prints and created their own designs. They were then shown how to use a screen printer and had a go themselves. The outcomes were great and the students came up with some really original work.

Later on in the day the students created prints of words and phrases to do with Sidmouth and used these to print on top





of Jeremy's work. A huge thank you to Jeremy and Anna for working with our students and teaching them such a great skill.

Primary Art Workshop

On Friday 1st November we welcome sixty lively Year 5 pupils from our feeder Primary Schools as part of our transition programme.

They then used different coloured ink to create a base for their work. After this they worked together to print onto each others work and layer their designs in different colours. The prints came out really fantastically and the students did so well they were able to make enough prints to take some home and let us keep some for a display in the College!

High Achievers

High achieving students in years 9-12 have been offered several opportunities to work with other like-minded students from local secondary schools and extend their learning this term.

On Tuesday 10th September, sixteen year 11 students attended The University of Exeter to complete an Aim Higher event. As well as outlining the opportunities available to them post-16, the day also gave an insight into University life and afforded the chance to explore the university campus by completing a treasure hunt.

These year 11 students, plus some of the high achieving year 12 students, then followed this up by attending a Challenge Day at Exmouth Community College on

Thursday 31 October alongside students from Exmouth Community College, Honiton Community College and The King's School, Ottery St. Mary. The day involved students being taken out of their comfort zone by working in mixed school groups to complete a series of challenges, testing their ability to complete riddles and puzzles, answer difficult questions and pitch a very mundane product to another group. It was amazing to find out how many different things you could do with an elastic band (hamster bungee jumping) or a pair of chopsticks (also known as 'the everything stick!') There was even some balloon blowing - and popping - involved to get the students thinking about their own mind-sets. The day ended with a session considering answers to some real Oxbridge interview questions.

Eleven Years 9 and 10 students have also embarked on the Challenge Plus scheme this term. The scheme gives students regular opportunities to work alongside students from nine secondary schools across Devon, Somerset and Dorset. This commenced with a Launch Day at the Gryphon School in Sherborne on Tuesday 12th November. Prior to the trip, students had to prepare a short presentation to answer the question 'what is learning?'. They then worked through a series of activities that addressed this question including building a 'learning web' out of wool and pipe cleaners, writing a song or rap about learning, completing maths and philosophy puzzles and preparing a group presentation on a learning strategy for a particular age group. Once again, students were taken out of their comfort zone by working in mixed groups from different schools.

The students in years 9-11 have also been having some mentoring sessions with Mrs Dudman, High Achievers Co-ordinator, thinking about what a grade 9 at GCSE requires and how they might get there. Furthermore, year 11 students have been being supported in preparation for their trial exams.

Next term will see years 10-12 students attending a More Able Learners Conference at The Wellington School in January and year 10 students attending a trip to Oxford University in March. Years 8 and 9 students will also be offered a University trip later on in the year and the Challenge Plus students will reconvene at Kilve Court in the summer term to catch up with one another and see how they have progressed as well as taking on some new challenges.
