This term Mrs Harrison in the Sidmouth College Library ran a competition based on the book 'How to be a Hero'.



### **Sixth From Common Room Refurbishment**

The Sixth Form at Sidmouth is a dynamic place. We have an extensive and ever-changing enrichment programme, have introduced new subjects and new activities over the past few years.



With the Sixth Form going from strength to strength, we would now like to update and improve our Sixth Form facilities to provide a state of the art Sixth Form Centre for our students.

The Sixth Form Centre is based in a retained area of the College, constructed in the early 1970s, and so has not been updated with the completion of our new building. With a year on year increase in the number of students who choose to stay at Sidmouth College to study their post 16 qualifications, the Sixth Form Centre is in need of some updating to provide space and facilities to provide the very best opportunities for learning. Having consulted with members of the Sixth Form, the College has focussed on improvements to the furnishings, décor and equipment of the Sixth Form accommodation in order to enhance areas for learning, private study and social activity.

The Sixth Form provides excellent opportunities for the young people of our locality, enabling students to develop their knowledge and skills as they move into adulthood and on to university, employment or further training.



### **Outdoor Seating and Dining Area**

Sidmouth College has recently undergone a rebuild of the main school building, which was completed in December 2020. The next phase of the regeneration of Sidmouth College is the removal of the 1960s three-storey block which is due to be demolished by July 2021.

For the final phase, we would like to focus on repurposing our outside areas to create outstanding facilities for our students. This will include a brand new terrace directly outside the new dining hall. This area will be used at break and lunch times for students to



eat outside. It will also be partially covered, providing shelter and shade and making it a year round area.

It will be used by teachers for outdoor lessons and also a quiet place for students to read or for Sixth Formers to work. The second outside area we are focusing on redeveloping is outside Room 49 and 50 (ICT huts). We hope to build an additional outside seating area for students to use during break times and it will also provide an eating area for students buying food at the snack shack.

### **Alumni News**

Former Sidmouth College student Kath Morton wins coveted place to train in Stage Management at the prestigious Royal Academy of Dramatic Art in London. The course takes only 12 students each year and thousands apply in the hope of gaining a place.

Kath left Sidmouth college in 2016 after her A levels intending to train as a Royal Navy Medic but as she had always been a keen outward-bound character she trained to work with young people working and living in the wilderness in Scotland. This year after finishing her degree she made the decision to follow her heart and take on the challenges of training for a career in the Theatre Industry.

Kath began her interest as a member of the Youth Theatre where she honed her craft firstly on stage and then working her way up to be the Company stage Manager. She was always at my right hand and could be relied upon to instinctively know what needed to be done. Even after she left she college she came back to help out backstage. I had always said to her she would be an incredible SM should she train professionally but at that point she had other plans.



It was to my great surprise and delight that she contacted me to tell me she had attained a place at RADA where she revealed that a chance moment, when she was considering what to do after her degree, she came upon her Youth Theatre Lanyard with the souvenir badges which all involved receive as a memento of their involvement in a Sidmouth Youth Theatre production and a card form the cast thanking her for being their Stage Manager. Taking a risk to apply as she had not been involved in theatre since 2017 and never thinking she would be successful she is now contemplating a transition from the wilderness of Scotland to the heady lights of London.

I am very excited to hear about her journey and she has kindly offered to come in and talk to students about her course next year. It is exciting to see that someone is embracing and challenging themselves to change their course and follow their passion. We wish her every success for the future.


### **Careers**

value a range of employability skills from future employees.



Students will be building on these skills in July when we are running two careers focused days with employers in place of work experience.


