Music is arranged by the Head of Music according to the individual skill levels of the musician in question. 		of the Tech Team, which is a third enrichment opportunity for any interested students, subject to interview.
Space for rehearsals and individual practice	There is open access to booking of available practice rooms every break and lunchtime, and after schools, as well as access to a professionally equipped digital recording studio.
