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Dear Students and Families,

Welcome to our Spring newsletter, bursting with examples of our brilliant young people taking opportunities to grow, be inspired and succeed beyond the classroom.

I would like to start by thanking you all for the support you give us every day, ensuring that our children are attending, ready to take on the opportunities we offer both in, and outside the classroom. As a school we have the best student attendance in our trust, which we are incredibly proud of. Our student survey tells us

that an increasing number of students feel positive about coming to school. This is crucial for their academic success, as was illustrated in a recent Department for Education report on attendance: 'The odds of year 11 pupils achieving a grade 5 in English and Maths almost double if their attendance is over 95%, compared to those who miss between 5% and 10% of lessons' Our focus on unconditional warm regard is developing a sense of belonging for all our students.

Year 11 and 13 are now into their final countdown for the summer exams and have been conducting themselves with maturity and focus, these crucial final 5 weeks have a real impact on the GCSE, BTEC and A-Level outcomes that our students achieve and we will work with you and our students to support and challenge them through this important

As you will already know Mrs Hurley is currently unwell and not in work, we are also now able to share with you that Mrs Hurley will be retiring at the end of this academic year. This is something that Mrs Hurley was planning before she became unwell; we are hoping that she may be able to return to work before the summer. We have now appointed Mrs Selena Burroughs as our new Head of Sixth Form from September,. We have been extremely fortunate that Mrs Burroughs has been able to support the work of Mrs Davey, Mrs Elliot and the sixth form tutor team in supporting Year 12 and 13 while Mrs Hurley has been off. We are really excited to have an experienced and passionate post 16 expert joining us at the college, Mrs Burroughs has the following message to share:

"Having worked in Post 16 education in East Devon for 30 years I am delighted to be coming to Sidmouth to take over the role from Mrs Hurley of Head of Sixth Form in September. Having lectured at Bicton College for nearly 20 years and more recently at Honiton College, I have a wide range of curriculum knowledge in vocational and academic qualifications and it is exciting to be coming to Sidmouth with their wide range of subjects on offer. As a qualified careers advisor I will also be working with the Sixth Form students to help navigate them through this stage and to explore their options for the next. This is a really exciting time for any 16 - 19 year old students and I am passionate about continuing the great work of Mrs Hurley and the team of creating a learning environment that fosters and encourages young people to become creative and technical intellectuals, achieving the highest outcomes and securing the best destination. Students will continue leaving the Sixth Form equipped with the skills needed to thrive at undergraduate level and in employment. I am very much looking forward to meeting and working alongside the students, parents and the wider community of Sidmouth"

Thank you to all the families who completed our trust parent feedback survey, you highlighted that you were pleased with how well informed you are with how to support attendance, the range of clubs and activities in the school and you are clear about what we expect of you as families. One of the areas that you highlighted as needing to improve was how easy it is to attend school events. To support this we will, more regularly, share when these events are taking place. Thank you to the Sidmouth Lions Club for their continued support of the College.




Media Studies

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Holland and Belgium Trip

On Thursday 13th February Mrs Hurley, Mrs Liddle, Mrs Cox and Mr Liddle took over 30 students from Years 11, 12 and 13 to Holland and Belgium as part of their GCSE and A-Level Philosophy and Ethics course.

The trip included visits to many sites in Holland and Belgium associated with the First and Second World Wars and gave students an eye opening and unforgettable experience. They began the trip with a focus on the Second World War, visiting the Anne Frank House in Amsterdam, Arnhem, Oosterbeck War Cemetery where men killed during the battle for the bridge at Arnhem are buried, and Vught Concentration Camp.

The second part of the trip focussed on the First World War. Three students laid a wreath for the College at the Last Post ceremony under the Menin Gate. The gate commemorates some of those killed in the First World War who have no known grave and has more than 54,000 names inscribed on it. The group also visited Essex Farm Cemetery, Langemark German Cemetery and had the chance to walk through a trench at Hooge Crater. The last stop was in Tyne Cott, the largest First World War cemetery containing 11,956 graves, 8,369 unidentified.

Throughout the trip the students were accompanied by an outstanding tour guide, Bruce, who used his wealth of knowledge and experience to make the trip very engaging for everyone.





Geography Fieldwork

On Thursday 27th March, Year 11 GCSE Geography students spent the afternoon collecting data for their upcoming Geography GCSE exam. The group visited Exeter City Centre and looked at two locations, Princesshay and Sidwell Street. They collected data on footfall, traffic and the environment and compared the results to analyse whether the regeneration of the City Centre has been successful. They also asked members of the public questions about their experience in the city and the reasons for visiting.
