


Gymnastics National Championships

The Gold award is offered to students in the Sixth form. It has five aspects which are volunteering, skills, physical, residential and expedition which can enable students to both gain recognition for things they already do and push them out of their comfort zone with new challenges. Students who take part in the award are given a huge bank of life experiences, providing concrete things to write and talk about in applications and interviews. It isn't the final award that singles them out, it is the life experiences that they gain. Achieving the Gold Award is a journey into organisation, resilience and independence.
