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Activities Week

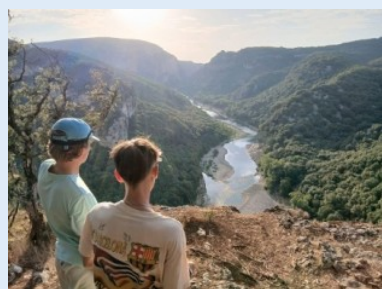
It's been a long and busy year, so to celebrate everyone's hard work and kick off the summer in style, students and staff enjoyed three days packed with exciting and memorable activities.

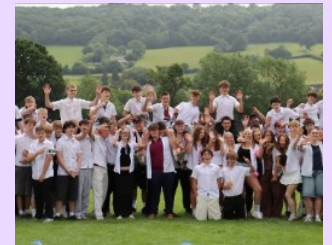


Year 11 Leavers Day

Everyone at Sidmouth College wishes our Year 11 students the very best for the future and we look forward to welcoming many of them back into our Sixth Form.

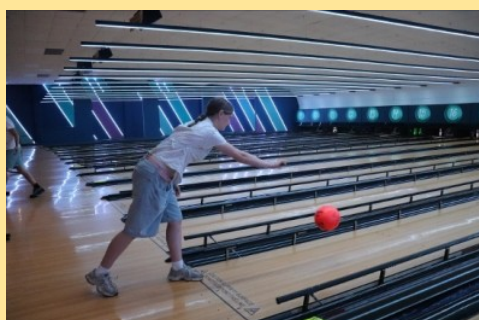


Years 8, 9 and 10 Reward Trips

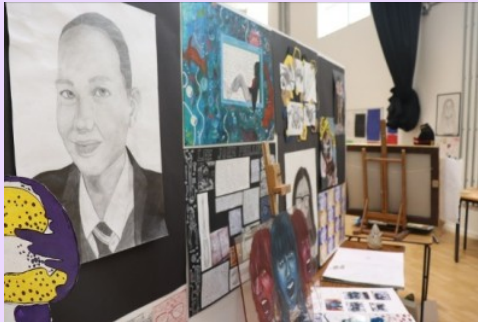




Art Exhibition

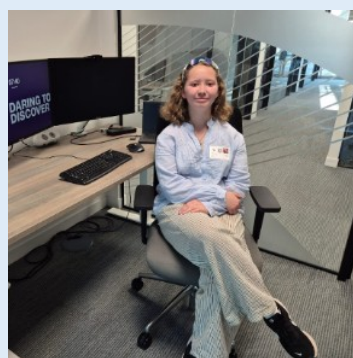


Work Experience
