

## Sentence Structure:

**Simple sentence** – Contains one main clause.

The girl cried.

**Compound sentence** – Contains two or more main clauses.

The girl cried; the English lesson was over.

The joke was funny and the girl laughed.

**Complex Sentence** – Contains one main clause and one subordinate clause – the subordinate clause can be placed at the beginning, at the end or in the middle of the sentence.

Even though she was in English, the girl cried.

The girl cried because she was in English.

The girl, who was in English, cried.
